- . Expectations of the students: program comparable to M.Sc. programs at other German speaking universities in relation to workload and study style; in contrast, the M.Sc. demands research orientation, full-time programme, combined academic work in many lectures, semester-long study, scientific work, study during the semester
- . Perception of a too high workload: 150 h per module, too much practical work alongside studies is absolutely unusual in most foreign universities (recommendation: apply for part-time studies) or MBA/PS
- . Challenges due to Corona crisis (a lot of homework and lectures, communication problems with group participants).

Positive for the programme is: many good applications, internationalisation. Focus is and remains Finance and Accounting

#### To point 4:

- .More Sustainable Aspects in the 1st semester
- .Corporate Finance is a repetition of the Bachelor, thus somewhat disillusioning.
- .Suggestion: Sustainable Finance in the 1st semester and Entrepreneurial Finance in the 3rd semester (deep dive).

Answer: Currently, the entrepreneurship master lets our students attend their "Qualitative Research Methods" course, while our master lets them attend our "Corporate Finance" course. Entrepreneurial finance is not a mandatory course in any program at the moment.

Another solution could be blended learning videos and then continue in advanced topics, what would be interesting deep dive themes? We see major differences between the two master programmes and the related finance skills from the bachelor degrees

.ldea to swap complementary studies or management studies (OSI) for 1 finance and accounting module is perceived as not achievable due to Leuphana study concept

.5 CP workload in Management Studies should not be higher than in Finance and Accounting modules while at the same time the finance and accounting core modules should not exceed the 150h workload limit

Expectations and reality are very different, 6 different courses with different topics is a lot of work.

Answer: We see ourselves as an international business school with higher expectations than many German universities.

Homepage better communicate higher expectations and requirements

Solution: in order to increase practical relevance and increase variety in study styles, we could do case studies rather than just pure scientific courses

Semester abroad: is usually difficult, as it extends the study period because the research project may not be credited. Concretise the list in the IO with the exchange places to include the item "Which universities offer empirical courses". Or participate in a PhD course abroad

Info on electives: We now always have an English alternative, Prof. Mody will teach Contemporary Issues in English. Our new honorate professor will also have a new English elective in digitalization and audit

Two courses with the title Sustainable Finance were totally inconvenient

Coordinate dates for exams better, coordinate individual partial dates of kWA in a meeting
